Frightened? Discouraged? Confused? Children are affected, too.

When children hear that parents or grandparents have been diagnosed with cancer, they may feel all these things and more.

Children, like adults, can benefit from professionals who understand their needs, as well. CLIMB (Children's Lives Include Moments of Bravery) is a free, five-week program designed to help children cope when someone they love has cancer by encouraging discussion and creativity.

The child's loved ones are also welcomed. The program increases their understanding of cancer and its treatment, as well as allows children to form new friendships and bonds with others going through the same thing.

All sessions are facilitated by a health care provider who is specially trained in the care of families coping with cancer.
