Penn State College of Medicine International Student Checklist Send the Acknowledgement of Acceptance form to the College of Medicine within two weeks of receiving your acceptance packet. Send required \$100 deposit by May 15th of the year you enter medical school. Send the Application for Visa Document and Proof of Finances form to the University Office of Global Programs (ISS) at the University Park campus. If you are now in the United States, copies of current visa, I-94, I-20, DS-2019 or other relevant documents should be sent to ISS with the form. (Please note that once ISS has received materials needed to issue a student visa eligibility certificate, it will take up to two weeks to prepare and send the document. If you are outside the U.S. and must apply for a student visa, your I-20 should be processed by University Park by June 1st of the year you enter medical school to allow time for you to obtain a visa and make travel arrangements. Please be guided accordingly in submitting documents to ISS.) Office of Global Programs web site: http://www.international.psu.edu Provide proof of finances to: 1. ISS at the University Park campus, for issuance of visa document. ISS must see evidence that funds are immediately available for all first-year expenses and must have an indication of the source(s) and amount(s) of funds available for future years of study. 2. Student Aid Office at the College of Medicine, to demonstrate ability to fund cost of medical education for four years. Documentation from a bank, a lending institution, government or other agency is due to the College of Medicine by May 15th of the year you enter medical school. International or Canadian students are not eligible to receive Federal or University loans. There are some loans available and information regarding these loans can be found at http://www.pennstatehershey.org/web/md/financialaid/international Loan approval must be secured and reported to Student Aid Office by May 15th of the year you enter medical school. Read, check for understanding, sign and mail the Acknowledgment of Financial Obligations of International Students to the Penn State College of Medicine by May 15th of the year you enter medical school. Be aware that all visa documents (I-20, DS-2019) are issued and processed through the International Student Services (ISS) office and must be sent to that office to be signed for travel or when any revision is needed. ISS is located at the University Park campus, a two-hour drive from the College of Medicine in Hershey. Allow sufficient time for such documents to be processed and delivered through the mail. Read The Pre-Arrival Guide for New International Students online under Students on the ISS website: http://www.international.psu.edu . Be aware that ISS at University Park must have a current permanent home address and this address must be one that is **outside** the U.S. Return housing application if applicable. Application available at www.pennstatehersheyhousing.com Send Health Insurance form and premium or a waiver form for health insurance due by "date by semester" posted on web site http://www.sa.psu.edu/uhs/internationalstudents/mandatoryinsurance.cfm or by contacting the Student Insurance Office at (814-865-7467). A completed application and payment for the premium must be received by the company or Penn State Student Insurance Office on or before the enrollment deadline listed. Premium received after these dates will be returned. DATE OF POSTMARK DOES NOT FULFILL THIS REQUIREMENT. There is a \$50 late fee for students who fail to fulfill the mandatory health insurance requirement by the established semester deadline.
